Parent Handbook

Humble Area's First Baptist Child Development Center welcomes you and your child. Our teaching staff is dedicated to making CDC a positive learning experience for children from twelve months to four years old (by September 1st). We want to meet the spiritual, emotional, mental, physical, and social needs of your child in a warm and loving environment.

SCHOOL HOURS

Monday and Thursday (9:30 a.m. - 2:30 p.m.) Before school or after school extended care is not available. CDC is a two-day week program where children are required to attend both days. CDC strongly encourages attendance each day.

The classroom will not be ready before 9:25 a.m. The classroom doors will be locked until this time. You must stay with your child until they enter the classroom. All classes begin at 9:30 a.m. It's especially important that our Pre-K students arrive on time because their academic lessons are starting. Your child must be picked up between 2:15 and 2:30 p.m. Your tardiness is not only hard on the teacher but also on the children. ***There is a \$5.00 late charge after 2:35 p.m. and an additional \$1.00 per minute every minute after 2:35 p.m.***

ARRIVING AND DEPARTING

Only the parents and authorized adults will be allowed to pick up the children. Please let the teacher know ahead of time if you will not be picking up your children. When leaving your child, it is very important to make it short and sweet. After you leave your child, crying is usually over very quickly. If picking your child up before 2:00 p.m. you need to sign our "Early Release" notebook in the CDC office.

CHURCH PARKING POLICY

Please do not block or park in the covered drop off area. Only those who have signed up to use our drop-off services may use it. (This is only provided for those with smaller children who do not attend CDC.) **This Fire/Emergency lane must be kept clear of unattended cars.**

EMERGENCY PHONE NUMBERS

A "Treatment of Minor Consent" form must be on file before your child will be allowed to attend our program. The hospital or physician requires this form in case your child should need emergency medical treatment. If your child should need emergency medical treatment, they will be taken by ambulance to Northeast Medical Center. All cost is the responsibility of the parent. ***It is the parents' responsibility to update new information as soon as it becomes available (for example, new address, new home or cell number, etc.) so that we will always be able to reach you at any time.***

WHAT TO BRING TO SCHOOL

Lunch - Each child will need to bring his/her own lunch with a drink. (No carbonated drinks please.) Wee Ones children will need to bring their drinks in sippie cups. Please label cups. Children should have food they can feed themselves. We recommend a healthy balance of protein, fruit, and veggies. We will be glad to open or help unwrap lunch items. However, teachers cannot be responsible to heat or refrigerate any items sent.

Sleeping Equipment - A nap mat or sleeping bag, blanket, pillow, etc. should be sent. Sometimes a favorite stuffed animal or blanket helps. Please label everything clearly.

Change of clothing - Each child will need to bring a full change of clothes including an extra pair of socks. All children in diapers should bring their own diapers. ***(Children three and up will need to be potty trained and out of pull-ups. After three accidents, the child will be moved to a "Two's" class if a space is available.)*** CDC recommends that children wear tennis shoes each day. Please refrain from putting them in sandals or flip flops. Unfortunate accidents may happen.

REGISTRATION

Our registration fee for one child is \$100, two children is \$150, three children is \$175, and four children is \$185. This is a once a year fee, neither non-refundable nor transferable nor applicable to monthly tuition fee. Yearly supplies are purchased with the registration fees. It also secures your child's placement for the coming year. CDC is funded only through CDC tuition.

CDC T-SHIRT

We have a blue t-shirt with our school's logo on it. Each month we have a designated "T-shirt" day for all students. These shirts may be purchased in the CDC office for \$12 each. It is also nice for our Pre-K students to wear this t-shirt on our "In-House" field trip days.

ACTIVITY FEE

Our Pre-K classes have an activity fee, which is \$25 per child for the year. This helps supplement the cost for our in-house field trips, graduation and special projects.

CURRICULUM

Along side your student's everyday curriculum, each child will attend Music every day, Move-n-Groove one day each week, and Chapel once a month. (Please note individualized curriculum on pages 5 - 7.)

TUITION

Tuition for one child is \$135, two children is \$235, three children is \$295, and four children is \$325 a month. Children attend classes two days a week. The first month's tuition will be due in September on Meet-N-Greet Day. Tuition will then be due on the first school day of the month. If tuition is received after the 7th of the month a \$10 late fee will incur. *If tuition is more than one month delinquent, the student may be withdrawn from the program.* **CDC salaries and overhead expenses cannot be reduced because of "Absentee losses" in income.** Therefore, we must charge, regardless of attendance, in order to support the enrollment space guaranteed for your child. We hope you understand our need for financial stability and we greatly appreciate your cooperation in this matter. Tuition is pro-rated for nine months.

SICKNESS POLICY

Upon the recommendation of the Committee on Control of Infectious Diseases of the American Academy of Pediatrics, a child should not be taken from home when any of the following exists:

1. fever within the last 24 hours
2. vomiting or diarrhea
3. common cold
4. symptoms of the usual childhood diseases (chicken pox, scarlet fever, etc.)
5. sore throat
6. croup
7. any unexplained rash
8. any skin infection (boils, ringworm, impetigo, skin or head lice)
9. pink eye or other eye infection

When in doubt, apply the "Golden Rule"- "Do unto others as you would have others do unto you."

Administrators will notify parents to pick up their children immediately if they show signs of illness.

MEDICATION

CDC is not allowed to give any type of over-the-counter/antibiotic medication. Likewise, do not send any medication for the child to take himself. If your child requires an Epi-Pen or asthma medicine, it needs to be up-to-date and remain in the teacher's locked cabinet with a signed consent form for it to be administered. If an allergy arises and the child begins wheezing, 911 will be immediately called.

PROGRAM WITHDRAWAL

Considering that we have an active waiting list for the program, we do require a two-week notice for those who plan to drop out of the program.

ADJUSTMENT TIME PERIOD

Sometimes preschoolers have a difficult time adjusting to the school setting. Students will be given two months to adjust to school. After two months, if a child is still crying or showing significant signs of separation anxiety, the student will be asked to withdraw from the program. Although students are old enough to enter preschool, sometimes they are not ready emotionally and we must be sensitive to their emotional development.

IMMUNIZATION

All students must have an updated copy of their immunization records. Please refer to your child's pediatrician or the State of Texas website for childhood immunization requirements.

WEATHER BULLETINS

BIRTHDAYS AND PARTIES

Birthdays are a special time for children. If you would like to bring a special treat to celebrate your child's birthday, please let your child's teacher know ahead of time. Please make these snacks as simple as possible. We find that cookies, brownies, or doughnut holes are well received by the children.

Parties for holidays are celebrated throughout the school year. These are fun events and we encourage parent volunteers to help join in the fun. We have 5 parties throughout the year (Thanksgiving, Christmas, PJ Day, Valentine's & Easter). A \$15 fee will be collected at the beginning of the school year to cover cost. Each class may have 3 or 4 Room Moms to help coordinate the parties.

On party days, parents are welcome to attend the party. However, if you attend the party and your child is upset when you leave, please take your child with you. Some of the children become very upset when the parents attend the party and then leave them at school for the remainder of the school day. This disrupts the resting period for the remainder of the class.

COOKING AND SCIENCE EXPERIMENTS

These will be done throughout the year. Special supplies will be needed for these exciting learning times. Your child's teacher may ask for help in supplying these items from time to time.

PRAYER

NEWSLETTER

FUNDRAISERS

HAFBC has a strict policy in place about fund raising. Fundraisers are not allowed on the premises for CDC, or any other outside school or organization.

DISCIPLINE PROCEDURES

Child Development Center has established a "No Corporal Punishment" policy. Teachers go over rules daily. When a rule is broken, one warning is given. When a rule is broken the second time, a warning is given with a consequence: time out, moving "behavior" clip (Threes and Pre K classes only). If a child does not respond to this discipline and is disruptive in class, the child is removed and taken to the director.

If a child bites (either breaking the skin or leaving a mark) or intentionally injures another child twice in the school year, the aggressor will be suspended for a period of 30 days. During the 30 day suspension, parents will need to continue to pay the child's tuition at half the regular tuition rate (\$67.50). If a third offense occurs, the child will be removed from the CDC program. Parents of both children will receive a "behavioral incident" report to be signed. All information concerning the incident will be kept confidential. The name of the child that was the aggressor, as well as the name of the other child, will not be released to either party. A copy of these reports will be placed in the child's CDC file.

The Children's Preschool Minister of Humble Area's First Baptist Church will be available for consultation in aiding the child and parents.

We understand that a child can go through many phases during their childhood. For the protection of each student enrolled at CDC we feel this policy is the best. If any needs, questions, or concerns arise, please contact one of the directors listed below:
